Overview:

This course is primarily an introduction to integral calculus (as opposed to differential calculus which is the focus of Calculus I). We will be covering material from Chapter 5-8 and portions of Chapter 9. There will be three exams, a final, homework, weekly labs and quizzes during the course of the semester.

Grading Policy:

Three regularly scheduled in-class (closed book) tests worth 17% each, homework worth 10%, quizzes worth 9%, lab reports worth 8% and a

comprehensive final exam worth 22% of the overall grade.
